SUZANNE MOSS, 84, passed away peacefully on March 25, 2018. When she wasn't serving her community, Suzanne loved to spend time with her seven grandchildren. She would keep as many of the grandchildren at the same time as possible, because as a grandmother, Suzanne valued the special relationships that cousins share.
